What Are You Known For?

Two weeks ago a 57-year-old Kansas woman, Shirley Neel, passed away. More than 900 people attended her funeral and visitation.

Was Shirley a political figure? A wealthy socialite? An important business owner? Someone famous?

No. By today's standards of importance, there was no reason to notice Shirley; she was "just a mother." Yet more than 900 people were so affected by her that they took the time to pay their respects and show her family how much she meant to them.

Why?

Because of her faith in the Lord.

Shirley didn't preach her faith or write books about it. Busy with 17 kids to raise, she didn't have time to chair ministry teams or be volunteer of the year at church. Shirley simply lived her faith, allowing it to permeate her actions and words each day. Her faith was the center of her life and it affected the people around her: teachers, coaches, store clerks, parents, neighbors, and family.

Shirley was known for her faith. What are you known for?

Every one of us can be known for our faith, even if we are "just" a mom, or "just" an ordinary person. We each have the opportunity to do God's work, even if we "just" work a regular job or "just" take care of our home. We don't need a ministry or money or power to affect people. Shirley's life attests to that. She didn't wait for the kids to grow up to start letting her faith affect people. She didn't wait until she had a different job or until she knew more about the Bible or until she felt comfortable. She simply let her deep love for the Lord permeate her life. She chose to make every moment count for Him and continually spread His love to others. And it made an impact.

Her faith was so powerful that you and I are learning from it today even though we didn't know her.

You have the same opportunity as Shirley, to live out your love for the Lord in all you do. When people think of you, do they think of your faith? When you leave a store, is the clerk left with a smile? When someone talks to you, are they encouraged? When you are no longer here, will others still look to your life for faithful encouragement and peace in the tough times?

What do you want to be known for? Are you living your life in a way that you will be known for this?

I want to be known as a woman who loved the Lord. Not a woman who was perfect, popular, or powerful, but as a woman who praised Him with every breath. I have a long way to go, but I will remember the amazing work God did through Shirley and be encouraged. I will stop taking my moment-to-moment life for granted, looking for the "big" opportunities, and each day focus on using where He puts me and what He gives me to show my love for Him.
