Following Christ isn't about obeying a lot of rules and living by long lists of do's and don'ts. The Jewish teacher who asked Jesus about the greatest commandment would have been well-versed in the 600+ laws religious people of the day followed.

Jesus gave us just two laws, both commanding love. Being a follower of Christ isn't about knowing how to look good on the outside or say the right things, it's about the attitudes of our heart. When our heart is filled with love for the Lord we love others because Christ loved them.

Think about your friends' kids. You love them, not because they are great and wonderful and better than other kids, but because you love their parents. Everyone on the planet is a child of God. So when we love the Lord with all we are, we love others too. And when this love for others guides us and we desire to please the Lord, we obey all God's commands – not as a check-list of do's and don'ts, but from the heart.
